DISSEMINATION OF DOH'S PUBLIC ADVISORY ON HAND, FOOT, AND MOUTH DISEASE (HFMD)

To: Assistant Schools Division Superintendent Chief Education Supervisors Unit & Section Heads Public School Heads Concerned All Others Concerned

- 1. In line with Division Memorandum No. 335, s. 2022 and OUGFO Memorandum No. 2022-03-1690 dated October 19, 2022, titled "Dissemination of DOH's Public Advisory on Hand, Foot, and Mouth Disease (HFMD)," this Office reiterates the importance of implementing preventive and control measures against HFMD in schools.
- The initiative seeks to safeguard school-aged children from the risks of HFMD. In this regard, all teachers and health personnel are strongly encouraged to continuously educate learners on the following preventive practices:

Frequent and proper handwashing;

- Observing health and safety measures such as the proper use of face masks; and
- Covering the mouth and nose when coughing or sneezing to prevent the spread of infection.
- Schools are directed to promptly report HFMD cases to the Division Office-School Health Unit for appropriate guidance and assistance, using the prescribed reporting template attached herewith.



DISSEMINATION OF DOH'S PUBLIC ADVISORY ON HAND.

FOOT, AND MOUTH DISEASE

This Office, through the Bureau of Learner Support Services-School Health Division (BLSS-SHD), disseminates the Department of Health's (DOH) public health advisory (Annex A) against the highly infectious Hand, Foot, and Mouth Disease (HFMD) common in young children.

This is to ensure the safety of the learners amidst of an outbreak of the disease in several towns in Batangas province, particularly in the areas of San Pascual and Cuenca, where over 100 children have been reported to have caught the viral infection, prompting the suspension of face-to-face classes in all public and private schools from elementary to high school.

In this regard, teachers and school health personnel are encouraged to educate the learners to practice preventive habits such as frequent hand-washing and to observe health and safety measures such as wearing of face mask and covering one's mouth when sneezing or coughing to avoid the transmission of infection.

Hand, Foot, and Mouth Disease

Hand, foot, and mouth disease (HFMD) is a common viral illness of infants and children. It should not be confused with foot-



and-mouth (also called hoof-and-mouth) disease of cattle, sheep, and swine. Infected individuals are most contagious during the first week of their illness. HFMD cannot be contracted from pets or animals. Incubation period is 2-14 days

Cause

A virus of the family Picornaviridee, genus Aphthovirus

Mode of Transmission

Spreads by contact with nose and throat discharges, saliva of infected persons, or after touching contaminated objects

Signs and Symptoms

- Fever
- · Sore throat
- · Feeling of being unwell (malaise)
- Painful, red, blister-like lesions on the tongue, gums. and inside of the cheeks
- Red rash, without itching but sometimes with blistering, on the palms, soles, and sometimes the buttocks
- · Irritability in infants and toddlers
- Loss of appetite

Treatment

- Treatment is directly toward relief of symptoms (fever and sore throat).
- There is no specific treatment. Signs and symptoms usually clear up in 7-10 days.
- A topical oral anesthetic may help relieve the pain of mouth sores.
- Over-the-counter pain medications other than aspirin, such as acetaminophen or ibuprofen, may help relieve general discomfort.

Prevention and Control

- There is no specific way to prevent the infection. Good hygiene (e.g., proper handwashing) can decrease the risk of spreading the disease.
- Disinfect premises and all infected materials (implements, cards, clothes, etc.).
