Consistent with the policies, progress checks shall be administered following the



- All SDO ARAL Focals are instructed to cascade this information to district and school implementers and to closely monitor the consistent administration of the checkin assessments across all ARAL learning sessions. Technical assistance must likewise be provided to ensure fidelity of implementation and proper use of ssessment results for learner intervention.



In accordance with Republic Act No. 12028¹, its Implementing Rules and Regulations, and DepEd Order (DO) No. 18, s. 2025,² and DepEd Memorandum (DM) No. 64, s. 2025,³ progress checks/assessments shall be administered to monitor learners' progress in the Academic Recovery and Accessible Learning (ARAL) Program.

In this regard, Table 1 presents the conduct of check-in assessments for Key Stages (KS) 1 to 3.
