





# CONSULTATIVE CONFERENCE CUM PROGRAM IMPLEMENTATION REVIEW ON SNED AND OTHER INCLUSIVE EDUCATION PROGRAMS

To: Schools Division Superintendents

- 1. Pursuant to DepEd's commitment to strengthening inclusive and equitable quality education, this Office shall conduct the Year-End Consultative Conference cum Program Implementation Review (PIR) on Special Needs Education (SNED) and Other Inclusive Education Programs on December 1–4, 2025 at National Educators Academy of the Philippines at San Vicente, City of San Fernando, La Union.
- 2. The participants in this activity are the Division Education Program Supervisors In-Charge in SNED and Edukasyon sa Pagpapakatao/GMRC/VE. Attached is the number of participants per SDO.
- 3. All SDOs are enjoined to ensure the attendance of the identified participants.   - d. share best practices and valuable lessons of each SDO;
  - e. formulate Catch-Up Plan for the delays of program, project, and major activities implementation.
  - f. provide technical assistance in adjusting the Work and Financial Plans (WFPs) including the use of the Program Management Information System (PMIS).

The travel and other incidental expenses shall be charged to the FY 2024 and 2025 Division SNED Funds. 


